Duties of Mess Orderlies.

To carry out all the instructions of the Master-Cook and the Orderly Sergeant ~~or Orderly Sergeant~~

To assist in preparing the meals.

To fall-in at the kitchen on the first note of the Bugle-call before each meal, No. 1 on the right.

To carry all rations to their Squads.

To wash all dishes and utensils after each meal.

Mess Orderlies are not to leave duty until they are dismissed by the Orderly Sergeant, with the sanction of the Master-Cook, and this is not to be done until the dishes have been inspected and passed by the Orderly Officer.

Marks will be taken off Buns for any breakages, which must be reported to the Orderly Officer by the Orderly Sergeant.

Duties of Fatigue Squad.

To thoroughly sweep up, clean out, and dust the whole Camp after breakfast, including the large hall, the officers quarters, the side-rooms, the passages, the lavatories, the passages and the precincts of the Hall.

To clean and trim all the lamps.

After this is done the Senior N.C.O. of the Squad will have the work inspected, and passed by the Orderly Officer <sup>by whose orders he</sup> and will then dismiss his Squad.

To perform any other duty that may be required by the Orderly Officer.



## Standing Orders

1. Prompt cheerful obedience to all orders, and "Honour bright" whether in camp or out of it.
2. Every Boy who comes to Camp is to be a Total Abstainer and neither to smoke nor chew tobacco.
3. Every Boy will be held responsible for making himself thoroughly acquainted with the Orders of the Day, and all other orders posted on the Camp Notice Board.
4. Every Boy must attend every

parade mentioned in the Orders of the Day, unless he has previously obtained leave of absence.

<sup>(Boots to be worn, well brushed.)</sup>  
5. At Full-dress Parades, Full uniform (with Haversacks folded) to be worn <sup>and arms and instruments carried.</sup> Haversacks must be kept clean throughout the Camp, and not worn except for parade.

6. Uniform Caps and Belts (over Jackets) are always to be worn when out of Camp, except for Bathing Parades and Fishing Parades, when caps only will be worn. Boys must never forget, when out of Camp, that they are members of the Boys' Brigade.



Standing Orders.

7. Boys must be very particular about Saluting. On meeting, or addressing an Officer, they will always salute, and use "Sir" when speaking to Officers or other gentlemen. Salute with hand farthest from ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> officer and turn the head & eyes towards him. Bring the hand up at the third pace before reaching the officer, and lower it at third pace after passing.
