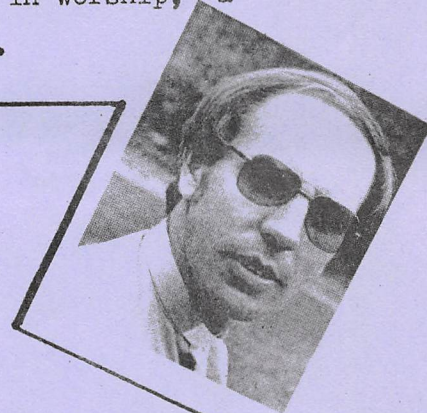

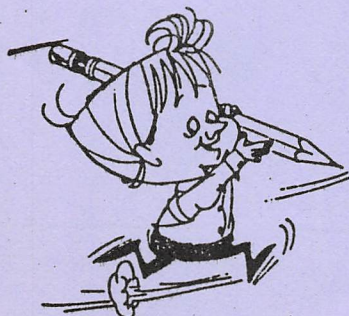

We from Sweden and Denmark would have loved to meet more of them.

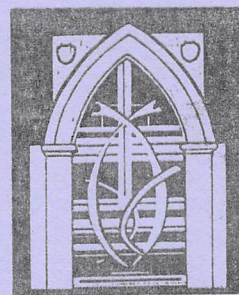
