

TENT PITCHING AND STRIKING COMPETITION

SEQUENCE OF ITEM

The Arena Orderlies will place 1 pole (in two parts) and a tent bag (containing 5 mallets, pegs and tent) by each of the RED coloured discs which represents the centre peg of a tent for erection purposes.

Teams will assemble at the pageant tunnel entrance to the arena in 3 ranks, i.e. A, B, and C. Rank 'A' will be on the left side of the tunnel facing the entrance to the arena with the N.C.O. in charge of team A.I. leading. Rank 'B' will be in the centre and rank 'C' on the right of the tunnel. Each team in ranks "B" and "C" will take up their covering and dressing from their corresponding Number in Rank "A". Further, each team will fall in with the N.C.O. leading and the remainder of the team in numerical order 1 - 5.

When the signal to enter the arena is given the teams, keeping their formation, will double into position to the right of their respective tents halting two paces away from the tent and turning into line by a right turn. Each team will dress by the left; the No. 1 team of each rank acting as the directing flank. Everyone will remain at attention.

PITCHING.

First Whistle.

- Action:- (a) N.C.O. assembles pole.
 - (b) No. 1 unlaces bag removes mallets and peg bag.
 - (c) Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 carry the tent to four paces from the centre peg in the direction of the point at which the rear peg will be inserted. (N.B. Ranks 'A' and 'C' will insert their rear peg so that it will be the nearest peg to rank 'B'. Nos. 1, 2 and 3 of rank 'B' will have their rear peg as the nearest peg to rank 'A' and 'A' and Nos. 4, 5 and 6 of rank 'B' will have their rear peg as the nearest peg to rank 'A' and so for rank 'A' and Nos. 4, 5 and 6 of rank 'B' will have their rear peg as the nearest peg to rank 'C'.) The tent will then be taken out of the bag and spread out, door uppermost, so that its base is just up to the rear peg; unroll all ropes and No. 2 should ensure the door is unhooked.
 - (d) N.C.O. and No. 1, using the pole as their measure, will meanwhile have inserted the four main pegs.
 - (e) N.C.O. will then place the pole beside the front peg.
 - (f) No. 2 will take the second rope on the right and left of the door.
 - (g) No. 3 will take the sixth rope on the right of the door.
 - (h) No. 4 will take the sixth rope on the left of the door.
 - (i) No. 5 will take number 11 rope from the right of the door.
 - (j) When all are holding their rope No. 2 will give the order pull and the tent should be pulled towards the front peg until No. 2 is able to secure both his ropes (at full length) round the front peg. When in position Nos. 3, 4 and 5 should fix their rope on to their respective peg at the right, left and centre positions.
 - (k) As this operation is being completed the N.C.O. and No. 1 should insert the pole making sure it is in the cap.

(1)

(1) When the pole is inserted, the N.C.O. will stand to attention by the pole, No. 1 will stoop by the pole and Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 will stoop by their ropes and await the second whistle which is the signal to lift the tent and make fast.

Second Whistle.

- (a) The N.C.O. and No. 1 will lift the pole and walk forward until the base of the pole is standing on the centre of the coloured pin which is acting as the centre peg.
- (b) Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 will tighten their respective ropes, while the N.C.O. ensures the pole is upright.
- (c) The N.C.O. will lace the inside of the door simultaneously with No. 1 lacing the outside of the door. The N.C.O. will then orawl out of the tent and hook up the curtaining beneath the door.
- (d) During the lacing of the door Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 will commence to insert the pegs, in line with each seam of the tent, travelling round the tent in an anti-clockwise direction. The runner when tightened must be 2/3 along the rope towards the tent. All runners must be on the same way round. Pegs must be driven into the ground so that the notch is 2" from the ground.
- (e) No. 1 will assist with pegging after lacing door.
- (f) The N.C.O. after hooking the curtain will check that all runners are on the right way.
- (g) On completion of erection the team will fall in line in front of the door of their tent and stand to attention.
- (h) The peg and tent bags will be placed in front of the N.C.O. Nos. 1 - 5 will carry the mallets.

STRIKING.

First Whistle

- (a) N.C.O. unhooks the curtaining of the door, goes inside the tent and unlaces the inside of the door, then stands by pole.
- (b) No. 1 unlaces outside of door and then helps Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5.
- (c) Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 roll up all ropes, starting from the right of the door, except the original main ropes (i.e. 2, 6 and 11 ropes).

On completion of these duties No. 2 will stand by No. 2 rope on the right of the door and Nos. 3, 4 and 5 will stand by their respective rope. The No. 1 will stand to attention four paces in front of the door with his right arm raised.

Second Whistle.

- (a) No. 1 doubles into tent and assists the N.C.O. to carry the pole, base first, out of the tent while Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 slacken off the main runners and roll ropes.
- (b) The pole should be placed by the front peg, the N.C.O. and No. 1 will then commence to remove the pegs.

- (c) No. 5 taking hold of the cap and assisted by Nos. 2, 3 and 4 will draw the tent to the rear, until the base of the tent is beyond the rear peg, spread out with door uppermost. The tent will then be folded as described on Page 47 last paragraph of the Campers Handbook.
- (d) When the tent is ready for placing in the bag No. 1 and No. 2 will hold the bag while Nos. 3, 4 and 5 insert the tent.
- (e) All the team will then assist to remove the remaining pegs. The N.C.O. will ensure that the peg bag and mallets are placed in the tent bag before it is finally laced.

Removal from site.

(a) The tent bag without further signal will be placed across the two poles. The N.C.O. and No. 1 will take the front and rear positions respectively on the poles so as to lift the poles stretcher fashion. Nos. 2 and 3 will assist on the N.C.O's right and Nos. 4 and 5 on his left.

aller.

(b) The teams will move quickly off by the most direct route to the cinder track on the side nearest to the running tunnel and proceed along the track until they come to the place for stowing the tents.

THE COMPETITION.

Marks 3, 2, 1 will be awarded as follows :-

Pitching - (a) from 1st Whistle - The first 3 N.C.O's standing to attention awaiting to lift their tent (no other member of the team moving).

(b) from 2nd Whistle - The first 3 teams in line at attention on completion of erection.

Striking - From 1st Whistle - The first 3 No. 1's standing to attention four paces in front of their tent with right arms raised (no other member of the team moving).

From 2nd Whistle - The first 3 teams seen moving off the arena in correct formation.

Total possible marks 12.

- N.B. (a) Remember that if anything goes wrong which delays either preparation for erection or striking Mr. Yates will not wait for you. It is essential, therefore, for N.C.O's to bear in mind that on the 3rd Whistle they must commence to strike the tent.
 - (b) If any team encounters difficulty in repacking the tent they must as quickly as possible move it off the arena onto the cinder track and convey it round to the exit.

MASSED BAND ITEM

1. COMPOSITION OF ITEM.

The item will consist of Band Marches played by two Massed Bands as follows :-

- (a) The Massed Bugle Bands of the London District.
- (b) The Massed Brass Bands of the London District and the Bugle Bands of the 5th London and 1st Enfield Companies.

These bands will play alternately and independently of each other.

2. COMMAND.

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The item will be under the command of the London Band Convener and each massed band will be commanded by an Officer who will march on the flank of the band's leading rank. No other Officer or Warrant Officer will appear in, or with, the bands.

3. ASSEMBLY.

Bands will assemble in Band Formation on the Parade Ground, and will be marched to the Pageant Tunnel of the Arena with Brass Bands leading ready for entry to the arena.

4. FORMATION.

Bands will be formed on a frontage of 12 files, each band being led by three Drum Majors, of whom the centre one will be the senior. Bugle Bands will be formed with drums leading and Brass Bands will be led by Trombone Players, the drums being in the centre of the band. The Drums of the 5th London and 1st Enfield will form up with Brass Band Drummers and the Buglers of these Companies will form the rear ranks of the Brass Band.

5. ENTRY.

At the commencement of the item, the Senior Drum Major of the Brass Bands will march the band straight out of the Tunnel across the length of the arena, with the command "Brass Band Ready - By the centre -Quick March".

The band will then commence playing two three pace rolls, and the March

"SUSSEX BY THE SEA"

When the band reaches the end of the grass area, it will counter-march to come to a position with its front rank in line with markers some 6 yards from the centre of the arena, i.e. facing the direction in which it came.

When the Brass Band has reached a predetermined position, the Officerin-charge of the Bugle Bands will give the command - "Bugle Band - By the centre - Quick March", and this band will march across the length of the arena, not playing, to arrive at a position 6 yards from the centre of the arena, facing the Brass Bands. It is the intention that these two bands should arrive simultaneously to their halting position.

As the Brass Band steps off, its Drum Majors will carry maces at the "trail" for six paces, and then come to the "carry" position. Bugle Band Drum Majors will keep their maces at the "trail".

When the two bands arrive at the halting position in the centre of the arena, they will mark time on indication from their Senior Drum Majors, will pick up their dressing, and will be halted by those Brum Majors in accordance with the drill therefor, the Bugle Band Drum Major taking his time from the Brass Band Drum Major, both performing the drill together, and halting both bands simultaneously. (For time of the halt see "Music"). The files of the Bugle Band will be opposite the spaces between files of the Brass Band, using the P.T. marks for this purpose.

6. COMMENCEMENT OF PLAYING.

The Senior Drum Major of the Bugle Band will give the command "Bugle Band - Ready", when the Bugle Band will come to the ready position, followed by the command "Brass and Bugle Bands - By the Centre - Quick March".

The Bugle Band will then commence playing two three pace rolls and the Bugle March

"ST. GEORGE".

Each Band will march through the other, each Bugle Band file passing to the <u>left</u> of its corresponding file in the Brass Band.

As the Bands commence marching, the Bugle Band Drum Majors will carry maces at the "trail" for six paces, then come to the "carry" position, maintaining this until their band ceases playing. When their band is not playing, they will revert to the "trail" position.

The Brass Band Drum Majors will march with maces at the "trail" while the Bugle Band is playing.

7. CONTINUATION FROM BAND TO BAND.

At the conclusion of the March "St. George", the Drummers of the Bugle Band will play "Drum Quickstep No.1" (Page 52 of The Boys' Brigade Book of Bugle Calls & Marches) twice (16 bars in all), followed by two three pace rolls.

As the Bugle Band comes to the end of the 2nd Quickstep, the Senior Drum Major will do the "cease playing" drill, and the Bass Drummer will give a double beat to indicate to roth bands that the three pace rolls will be played next.

At the commencement of the second Quickstep, the Drum Majors of the Brass Band will come to the "carry" position, and the leading Side Drummer of the Brass Band will tap his sticks to bring the Side Drummers of that band to the "ready" position to play the three pace rolls at the same time as the Bugle Band Drummers.

The Brass Band, which will come to the ready position during the two three pace rolls, will then play the March

"SONS OF THE BRAVE".

At the conclusion of this March, the drums of the Brass Band will play Quickstep No.2 (Page 52 of the B.B. Book) twice (16 bars in all), followed by two three pace rolls.

Towards the end of the second Quickstep, the Drum Majors will do the "cease playing" drill, and the Bass Drummer will give a double beat to indicate to both bands that three pace rolls are to be played. The mace bearers of the Bugle Band will come to the "carry" at the beginning of the second Quickstep, and the leading Side Drummer of the Bugle Band will bring the drums to the "ready" in the same way as the Brass Band did previously, so that the Side Drummers of the Bugle Band can play the two three pace rolls with the Brass Band Side Drummers. Buglers will come to the "ready" position on the lst and 3rd beats of the three pace rolls. The Bugle Band will then play the March

"DRUM MAJOR" .

At the conclusion of this March, the Bugle Band will play the Quickstep "Grenadiers" (16 bars) once only (page 50 of the B.B. book), followed by two three pace rolls. Signals will then be given by the Bass Drummer and Senior Drum Major of the Bugle Band, the Drum Majors and the leading Side Drummers of the Brass Band as before, the last two giving their signals 8 bars before the end of "Grenadiers".

The Brass Band and the Bugles of the 5th London and 1st Enfield will come to the "ready" during the three pace rolls, and will then play the March

"TUDOR ROSE" .

8. CONCLUSION OF THEM.

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E

It is intended that the leading ranks of the Bands should be facing and marching towards each other, some 80 yards apart, at the conclusion of "Tudor Rose". At a predetermined point, the Senior Drum Major of each band will wheel his band, the Bugle Band to the <u>right</u>, and the Brass Band to the <u>left</u> and line up facing the dais ready for the Brass Band to play for the entry of the Old Boys. When wheeling, the files of the bands will close up to reduce the wide frontage that they had for inter-marching. Senior Drum Majors will indicate the "Mark Time" and bring their bands to a halt simultaneously. Both bands will stay in the arena for the Old Boys' Parade and Closing Service.

9. DISMISSAL. At the conclusion of the performance, the Bands will remain until the Old Boys are dismissed, and then will march out of the arena on orders from their respective Commanders.

- 2. Drum Majors and Bass Drummers. These will be selected at the rehearsal on May 26th. Battalion Band Conveners to be responsible for seeing that their best Bugle Drum Major is present at this rehearsal. All Brass Band Drum Majors will also parade.
- 3. <u>Marching</u>. All Marching will be "By the Centre" and all counter-marching will be to the left.
- 4. Drum Majors Drill. Drum Majors will drill as laid down by a circular obtainable from the London Office. There will be no mace "swinging".

Senior Drum Majors will be responsible to see that their band's pace is regulated so that the bands cross in the centre of the arena.

- 5. <u>Bugle and Drum Drill.</u> Apart from the opening March "St. George" when the command "Band Ready" is given by the Drum Major I/C Bugle Band, Bugles and Drumsticks will be brought to the playing position in two movements, each made as the left foot comes to the ground, as follows:-
 - 1. On the first and third beat of the first of the three pace rolls. (This applies to Bugles only separate instructions have already been indicated for Drummers).
 - 2. On the Ninth and Eleventh beats of 8 bar parts,
 - 3. On the Twenty-fifth and Twenty-seventh beats of 16 bar parts.

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Bugles and Drumsticks will be returned to the non-playing position in two movements (again as the left foot comes to the ground), on the first and third beat of the part following that which the Buglers and Drummers have played.

6. Music.

Bugle Band. The Bugle Marches will be played through once only. The strains will be played as to one half of Buglers and Drummers first time, and the other half will repeat the strain. All Drummers of the Band which is playing will play the Quicksteps.

Brass Band. The Brass Band marches will be played as follows: -

"SUSSEX BY THE SEA". It is anticipated that twice through "Sussex by the Sea" will be just right to allow bands a sufficient period of marking time to pick up their dressing.

"SONS OF THE BRAVE" and "TUDOR ROSE". These Marches will be played to the bottom of the page only, making such repeats as are shown: i.e. they will not be played D.C.

CLD BOYS' PARADE and CLOSING SERVICE.

Separate instructions will be issued for the Brass Bands' part in this.

GENERAL.

It is essential that particular attention be given in rehearsals to Marching and Dressing, since however well the playing of the bands, the whole effect can be lost by bad drill.

The Band will then march to the end of the Parade nearest the Pageant Tunnel and counter march so as to be ready to lead the Parade in the March Past. (The whole Parade must be in position by 3.25 p.m.) At 3.27 p.m. the Duty Buglers will sound "Rouse"

At 3.29 p.m. - Officer Commanding will order - "Brigade - Attention".

3.30 p.m. - Arrival of Lord Maclay, Bishop of Willesden and party.

Officer Commanding will order - "General Salute". This will be played by the Duty Band.

The President's party then moves to the Drums.

Officer Commanding will order "March off the Old Colours".

The Old Colour Party will move forward in quick time to the Royal Tunnel and Exit.

The Duty Band will play "Auld Lang Syne".

Officers, Warrant Officers, Staff/Sergeants will salute.

The New Colours cased will then be brought from behind the centre of the Parade (without orders) by two Staff/Sergeants (who will not wear carriers or carry sticks) at the slope on the right shoulder in quick time. The Queen's Colour on the left.

The cased Colours will not be saluted. The New Colour Party will move forward at the same time as the Staff/Sergeants, but ten paces in their rear. The whole party will halt when the Staff/Sergeants are two paces from drums.

The cased Colours will be ordered. The District Colour uncased and layed diagonally across the drums. The Queen's Colour will then be uncased and layed on top and across the District Colour.

The Staff-Sergeants will roll the cases and holding them in their left hand, turn about and return to their Company.

Officer Commanding will order "Brigade - Stand at Ease -For Prayer Uncover".

Then follows by the Bishop: Prayers

Consecration of Colours Hymn "Onward! Christian Soldiers" Verses 1, 2, and 4.

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The Parade will replace caps after the prayers, without orders.

During the singing of the third verse, the Colour Party will move forward to two paces from the Drums.

Officer Commanding will order "Brigade - Attention".

The Queen's Colour will then be lefted by the Bishop and Handed to Lord Maclay, who will hand it to the Officer on his right. The Officer will receive this kneeling.

The same procedure follows for the District Colour.

Both will rise together.

The Bishop will pronounce the Blessing.

The "General Salute" will then be sounded by the Duty Band, while the Colour Party remains fast.

The Colour Party will then form and return to their Company, while the Duty Band plays the <u>National Anthem</u>.

MARCH PAST

The President's party will return to the Saluting Base.

Officer Commanding will order "PARADE - Move to the Right in Column of Route - Form Fours - Right Turn - By the Left - Quick March".

The Parade will march past in Column of Eights - wheeling <u>left</u> on reaching cinder track.

On reaching Saluting Base, 0.1.Cs Battalion Detachments on the left of the Column of Eights, will order "Eyes Left". On passing Saluting Base, he will order "Eyes Front".

Battalion Detachments will leave the Arena by wheeling Right into the Tunnel as indicated on Plan.

The Bugle Band will wheel Left at the Tunnel onto the grass, counter march and halt, and play the Parade out.
