As most of you will know, The Boys' Brigade National Brigade Council once again considered a motion to admit Girls to membership of the Brigade. Although, there was a narrow majority in favouramongst those present at the meeting, the motion was defeated by the proxy votes received from those not present.

However, the issue attracted much publicity from the National Press and will no doubt be raised again at a future Council meeting. In the mean time, the GA continues to make provision for those Boys' Brigade Companies who wish to work with Girls.

Jerseys

You will probably be aware that there has been a delay in the supply of Boys' Brigade jerseys. As our arrangement is connected with the firm who supplies these, and that arrangement is by grace and favour, our supply will inevitably experience more delay than those specifically for The Boys' Brigade.
