

held on 14th. May, 1914.

The Lord Provost referred to the death which took place on the 9th. instant of Sir William A. Smith, a highly esteemed citizen and the founder of the Boys' Brigade. Having alluded to the late Sir William's remarkable career and to the fact that the great organisation with which his name is associated had its origin in Glasgow, the Lord Provost moved that the Corporation record in the minute of this meeting their sense of the loss which, by his death, the community had sustained, and that an excerpt from the minute be sent to his family.
