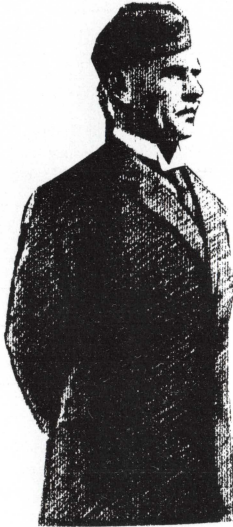

Hello, I'm David and I'm going to tell you about the Junior Section — what we wear, what we do, how we gain our Badges and how The Boys' Brigade began.

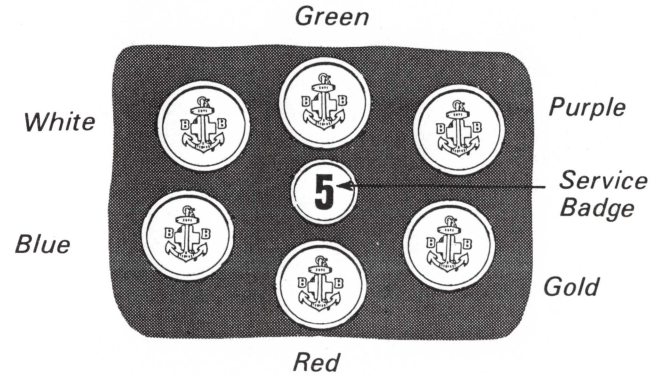
WHAT WE WEAR

Description of all uniform — with Armband, Shoulder Title, Leading Boy Badge and Service Badge.



HOW WE GAIN OUR BADGES

You can gain badges and I have four — my White, Green, Purple and Blue and I am working for my last two Badges — the Red and Gold



If we earn our Gold Award in the Junior Section we can wear a special Gold Badge when we join the Company Section.

I have another book that tells me what I have to do for Badges. Ask your Officer if you can have one.

JUNIOR SECTION

GO FOR GOLD!



Do you see how smart this Boy looks? Can you look just as smart? Here are some points to watch:

Make sure that your shirt or vest does not show above the neck of your Jersey.

Never wear a tie with your BB Jersey.

If you wear a Shoulder Title it should always be worn at the top of the left sleeve of your jersey.

If you are made a Leading Boy you wear your "Leading Boy" Badge above your Jersey Badge.

TRY THIS HAT QUIZ

Put your BB Hat on and look in a mirror:

Is your hat tilted slightly to the right, with the front seam in line with your nose?

When looked at from the side is your Hat horizontal?

Have you tapped down the crown of your Hat to give a dipped effect in the centre?

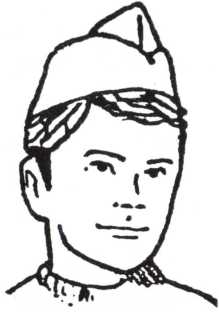
Is your Hat well brushed and in good shape?

WHAT WE DO



Each week we do lots of different things. Some things we do each week and others we do some-times. Every week we have an Opening and Closing Service when we worship God and learn about Jesus. We learn about Jesus when he was a Boy like us and we try to live like Him.

We do not know very much about how Jesus grew up, but we can guess the sort of things that He did as a Boy from the stories He told later in His life. He played with other Boys and Girls, learning to win and lose; He discovered all He could about things around Him; He read His Bible — our Old Testament.

In the BB we do the same sort of things.

A Uniform must be tip-top from top to toe! Make an extra special effort when cleaning your shoes, and remember, the best time to clean them is before you clean yourself.

However smart your uniform may be, the effect will be spoilt unless you also have clean hands and a clean face.



DO YOU WEAR A BB BUTTONHOLE BADGE?



I wear a Buttonhole Badge.

When you are wearing your uniform, people will know you are in the BB, but when you are wearing ordinary clothes people will still know you are in the BB if you wear your Buttonhole Badge. You will also be very surprised at the new friends you will make when other Boys, and older people too, see your Badge.

Perhaps some of the Boys in your class at school will want to come and join your Section so that they can wear the Badge too. If you would like a Buttonhole Badge ask your Officer to get one for you.

Each week we learn to play and work together with other boys.

We all belong to a group. You can gain points for your Group by doing your best in all the Section's activities.

I try to make sure that my Group is the best, and you can help to do this for your group by attending the Section Meetings and Sunday School regularly.

We learn to make things, act in plays, take part in mimes, play games, make music, march and lots of other things. We also all work for our Badges in the Achievement Scheme.
