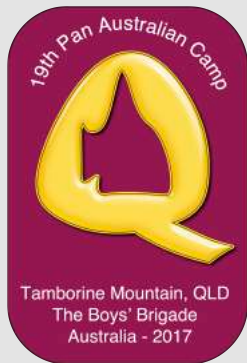

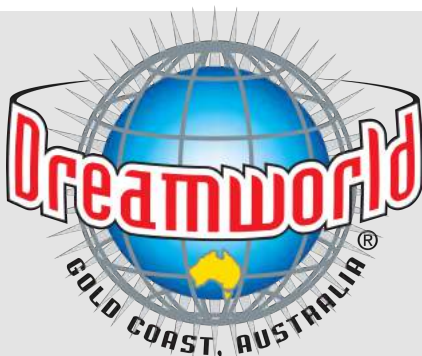

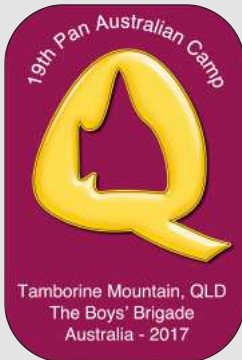

We had the pleasure of Mr Max Gray, the founder of PA Camps; join us for the Opening of PAC 19.

Mr Max Gray, the then Captain of 37th NSW Burwood Company, organised the first P.A. Camp at Narrabeen NSW in Dec 1962-Jan 1963. The next Camp at Southport QLD in Dec 1965-Jan 1966 was largely organised by the B.B. in Queensland with Mr Gray as C.O. (Commanding Officer)

Mr Gray continued to lead a national Camp Committee for the 3rd, 4th and 5th Camps working in conjunction with local State groups. Max was an inspiring leader and also managed to serve as Australian President from 1970 to 1977. He was honoured for his contribution to P.A. Camps at the last Camp in Queensland (PAC 13) in January 1999.

It is truly a great to see his legacy carried through to its 19th Camp in 2017

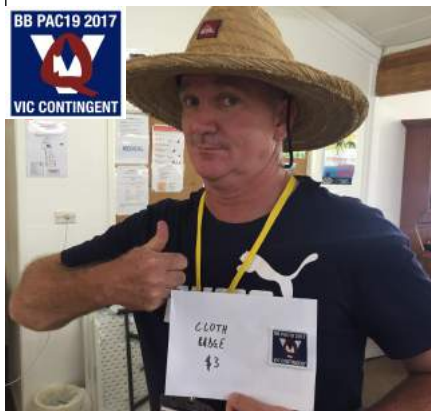

Josh has thoroughly enjoyed the water slide describing it as "the worst, best idea ever!"

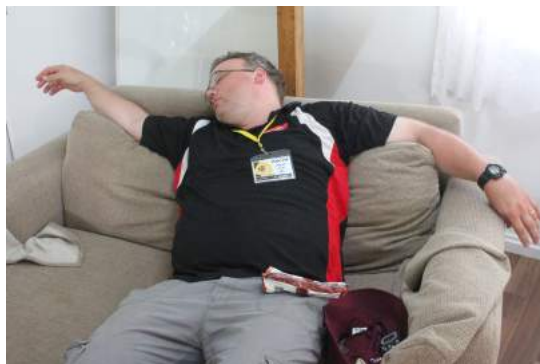
Hikes Reminder:

QCCC is one of Queensland's largest Outdoor Education ministries. If you love our sites and our activities, we have a training pathway into Outdoor Education with the CAMPFIRE Internship. It's a two-year program giving you a foundational understanding of the Christian faith and training in Outdoor Recreation which prepares you for ministry and career in the growing Outdoor Education sector. In the first year the focus of the internship is on organic discipleship from several spiritual mentors and a significant component of a Certificate III in Outdoor Recreation (SIS30413). At the end of the first year an individual program for the second year will be discussed and implemented between student and mentors, incorporating continued mentoring and discipleship, overseas mission trips and work in Outdoor Education completing the Certificate III in Outdoor Recreation and possibly some elements of a Certificate IV in Outdoor Recreation (SIS40313). QCCC's operations are growing at a rapid rate so beyond the internship there's a great career pathway too.

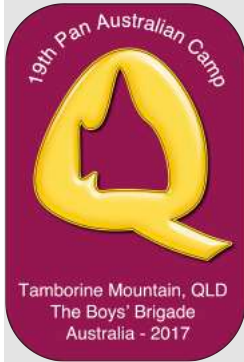

My First PA Camp was Tops. – Warren Finnen. Three time former PA Camp Director.

PA Camps have altered big time since I went to my first camp, the 3rd PAC at Stanwell Tops near Sydney. We had over 600 Boys and Leaders in tents with a massive dining room, two canteens in tents and a fearsome assault course built over a boggy swamp complete with ladders, jumps, mud holes and leaches! The ground wobbled as we ran over it. Each morning a bugler would play "reveille" while chosen Boys (in uniform) raised all the state and camp flags. The process was reversed at sunset when the flags were lowered. A network of manual army telephones connected Admin with each Camp Company OC.

PentaPAC started at the 3rd PAC and it was so hard that less than 20 Boys were awarded Gold. I missed out as my assault course. Time was 20 seconds too slow.

Our PAC 19 Camp CO, Don Smith was our Camp Company OC right back then in January 1969.

Primitive, yes. Basic, Yes but awesome fun. The Lord has led me to a lifetime of BB and Camps and 17 PA Camps later here we are at Tamborine Mountain.

So get ready for the adventure that your Christian life will bring. Which way will you choose to live?

From the Camp Director (Don Smith)

As we prepare to complete PAC19 and go to our homes, I am reminded of the three things I asked that we all do – full participation, care for yourself and take every opportunity to care for and serve others. Over the last week we have seen many examples of these three challenges in action. Thank you for this and congratulations on your achievements and the contributions you have made to the camp and to others.

I want to share just one simple example of a young man here who demonstrated service in action. One day at the water slide boys had trampled grass into the toilet block. I went to the slide and asked that someone clean the block. James Lun quickly offered. 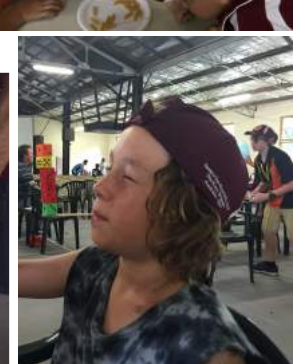

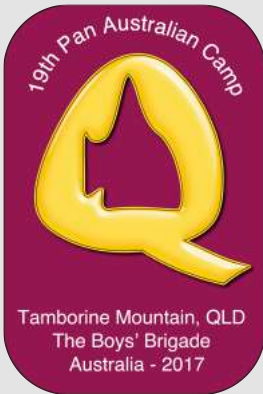


CAMPER FREE TIME

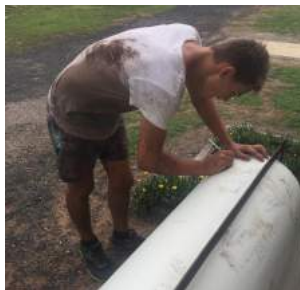
