# **Recent post from our Social Media**

On the 29th June we posted - 13 NCOs of the 15th Belfast Company, all holders of The King's Badge. Extract from The Boys' Brigade Gazette, April 1945.

#### KING'S MEN OF ULSTER

BELFAST is synonymous with B.B. proficiency. Nowhere is there a higher general standard in B.B. work than in that vigorous city. Our picture justifies the claim. It shows thirteen Non-Commissioned Officers of the 15th Belfast Company, all present holders of the King's Badge. The only exception is the lad sitting in the centre, who cannot yet claim this distinction among his battle honours.

This is a Company already not unknown to fame, and we hardly expect its record in King's Badges to be challenged, for it has now won a very grand total of eighty-one.

The 15th is a strong Company of 125 Boys and Officers. Its present position is the more honourable in that it is among the valiant band, bearing the scars of battle, who suffered sorely in the great air onslaught of 1940-41, when its Church building and Company headquarters were totally destroyed, with sad loss of life among the Boys.

To-day, higher in numbers and stronger in spirit than in the palmy days of peace, top in B.B. Week for all Ireland, a giant among giants, the 15th marches from strength to strength, and the end of their upward progress
