

4th Kirkcaldy banner.

Daniel Green writes:

During lockdown, The Archive Trust obtained a double-sided painted banner for the 4th Kirkcaldy company which looks as though it may have been painted on linoleum. Kirkcaldy was once famous for the production of Linoleum through Nairn's great factory. The owner of the factory, Sir Michael Nairn, was a great supporter of the 4th Kirkcaldy Company.

Raymond Allerton contacted the Fife Museums who are currently running a two-year project called "Flooring the World," which details the history of the manufacturing of floorcoverings in Kirkcaldy.

The banner held in the Carronvale Archive store has a detail about 4th Kirk-caldy Silver Band on one side and the other side has two boys flanking the Victoria Halls. The Victoria halls were purchased for the company in 1905 and were officially opened in September that year. That might give us an approximate date for the banner between 1905 and 1920. The Victoria Halls have recently been sold to property developers, and the banner had been found in the roof space of the hall.



On Tuesday 17th October we received a visit from Gavin Grant of Fife Museums who suggested that the banner was not linoleum but was actually floorcloth a forerunner to Linoleum that ceased production around 1920.






